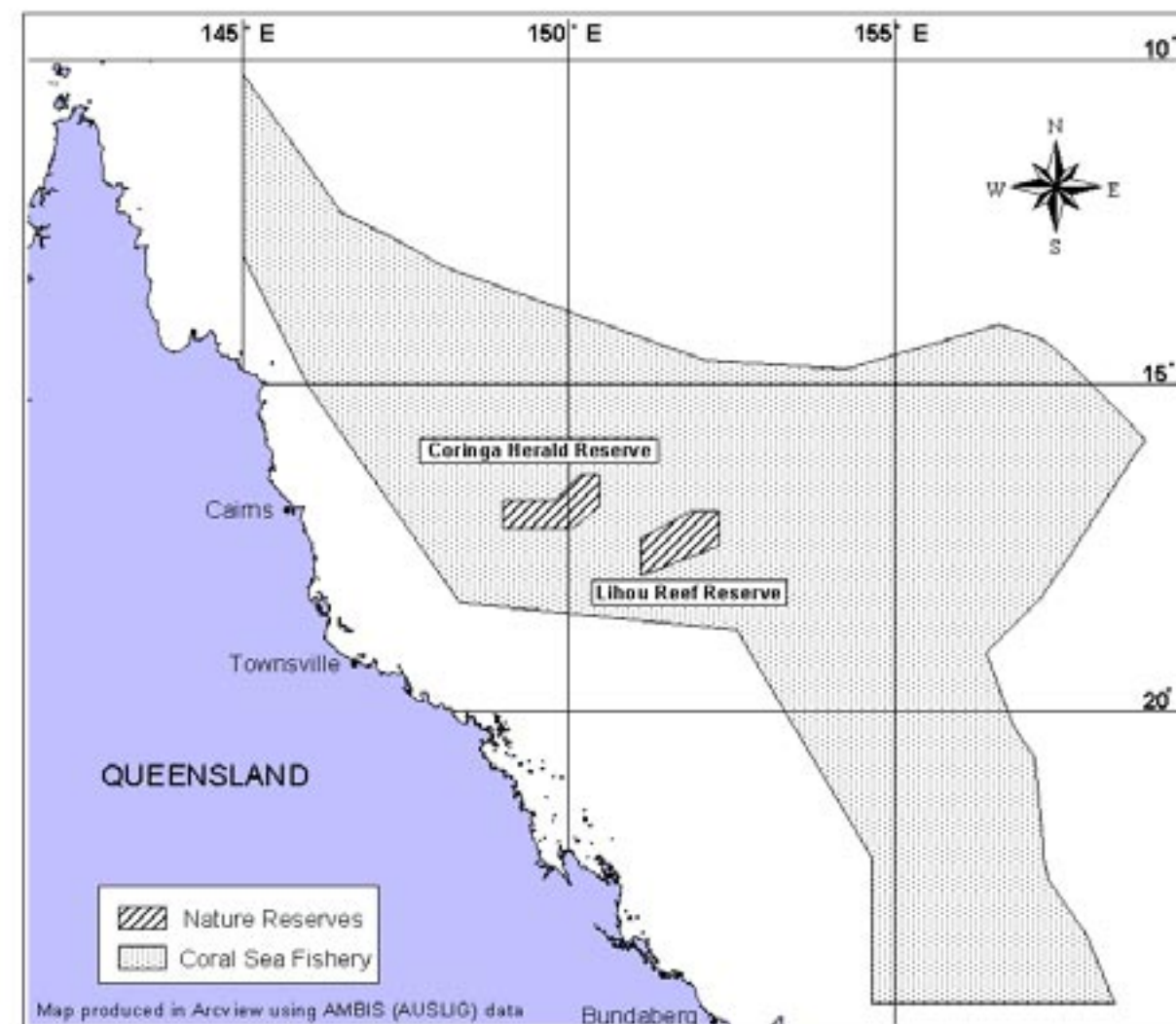

GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR HOLDERS OF FISHING CONCESSIONS

Purpose

This logbook is to be used when fishing by dropline, demersal longline, trotline, trawl or collector methods in the area of the Coral Sea Fishery. It is designed to provide a continuous record of all fishing operations undertaken in the Fishery by Commonwealth fishing concession holders.

Accurate data collected in this logbook is essential to provide information for research into and management of Australian fisheries.

Important Information and Instructions

Completing the logbook

- This logbook must be completed for every day that the fishing concession is in force, regardless of whether or not fishing takes place on that day (see the “How to Complete this Logbook” section).
- All logbook information must be recorded on a daily basis and details for the last day of the trip must be recorded before the boat docks at the end of each trip.
- The pages in this logbook are self-carbonating. Please use a ballpoint pen when completing forms. Place the fold-out flap under the original and duplicate pages to prevent writing transferring to the next set of forms.

Location of the logbook

- This logbook must be on board the boat that is nominated in respect of the fishing concession and named on the front of the logbook during fishing operations.
- This logbook must remain within a 50 metre radius of the boat.

Who should use this logbook ?

- The holder of the fishing concession is responsible for ensuring that this logbook is completed and that it is certified as complete and correct.
- The holder can do these things personally. Alternatively, the holder can ensure these things are done on their behalf by a person authorised in writing to do so by the fishing concession holder in the approved form. Contact AFMA for details of how to authorise another person to complete the logbook.

Submitting logsheets

This logbook contains numbered pages in triplicate which are referred to as logsheets. Original copies must be returned to AFMA in date order in either the reply paid envelope provided or posted to:

by the 14th day of the following month, eg logsheets for March are due by the 14th of April. Duplicate copies should be retained.

Vessel and Gear Details form

The fishing concession holder must ensure that the Vessel and Gear Details Form attached to this logbook is accurately completed and returned to AFMA within 14 days of receipt of the logbook.

Additional forms are available from AFMA if required. The fishing concession holder must ensure that additional forms are completed and returned to AFMA if any boat and/or gear details, or contact details of any person authorised to complete this logbook, change.

Catch Disposal Records

Fishing concession Holders permitted to take beche-de-mer must complete a Catch Disposal Record at the end of each trip. Catch Disposal Record forms and instructions on how to complete them are provided at the back of the book.

Penalties

Fishing concession holders and persons completing this logbook on their behalf are advised that:

- (i) a failure by a fishing concession holder to ensure the completion of the logbook in accordance with these instructions;
- (ii) the giving of false or misleading information in the logbook by the fishing concession holder or a person completing the logbook on their behalf; or
- (iii) the recording or communicating by the fishing concession holder or anyone else of information in a logbook concerning the affairs of another person, or the giving by the fishing concession holder or anyone else to another person of a part of a logbook in which information is recorded, (unless the recording, communicating or giving is done in accordance with the *Fisheries Management Act 1991*, *Fisheries Administration Act 1991* or the *Fisheries Management Regulations 1992* or an order of court, tribunal or a person authorised to receive evidence)

may constitute serious offences under Commonwealth laws.

Concession holders are also advised that failure to ensure the completion of the logbook in accordance with the instructions may lead to suspension or cancellation of their concession.

If you are collecting, you must complete catch and effort details from each location, for every day you collected and complete a Catch Disposal Record for each trip.

PAGE HEADER

Enter the vessel name, distinguishing symbol and Master's name here.

NON-FISHING PERIOD

If you have not fished for an extended period, fill in the non-fishing dates in the appropriate section and specify the reason by ticking the relevant box. This will reduce the number of logsheets needed to account for every day your fishing concession is valid.

COLLECTOR SECTION

Fishing Details

Non-Fishing Code: If you do not fish on a particular day of your fishing trip, write a Non-Fishing Code for that date. The Non-Fishing Codes are listed below. If you fill in this box, do not complete any more of that column.

Location: Record the location at which you dived, as latitude and longitude in degrees and minutes. A separate column must be completed for **each location** and **EACH DAY** you fished. If diving is

carried out at the same location on a different day, a new column must be completed.

Date: Record the date of collecting here.

No. of Tenders: Record the number of tenders in use.

Dive Method: Circle whether divers were free diving or using SCUBA and/or Hookah equipment. If you used more than one method, circle each method that you used.

No. of Divers in Each Dive Method: Please record the number of divers using each dive method, collecting at this location, on this day.

Total Dive Hours: For each dive method, record the total combined number of dive hours spent at this location, on this day. Dive hours refers to bottom time.

Maximum Depth: Record, in metres, the maximum depth at which you were collecting.

Whole Unprocessed Catch: The main species likely to be caught have been listed. Any other species caught should be recorded in the blank spaces provided. Please specify any other species caught.

An estimate of the whole wet weight of each species caught should be recorded in kilograms (kg).

The accurate number of each species caught must be recorded.

COMMENTS

This part of the logsheet has been included so that you can make comments to AFMA or record relevant information eg. weather details, gear malfunctions, tagged fish etc.

SIGNATURE BOX

The Concession Holder or Authorised person must sign and date each logsheet after it has been completed. His/her name must also be printed in the space provided.

CATCH DISPOSAL RECORDS

Catch Disposal Records must be completed at the end of each trip. These forms are located at the back of this logbook

LINE FISHERS: How To Complete This Logbook

If you are demersal longlining or trotlining you must complete catch and effort details for every shot you make. Details for each shot must be recorded before completing the next shot. Details for the last shot of the trip must be completed before the boat enters port.

If you are droplining you must complete catch and effort details on a daily basis. Details for each day's fishing must be recorded at the end of each day. Details for the last day of the fishing trip must be recorded before the boat enters port.

Set Dropline

A set dropline is not attached to the vessel. It is set, and then left in the water until it is retrieved.

Working Dropline - manual hauling

A working dropline remains attached to the vessel at all times. Manual hauling refers to a manually operated deck winch.

Working Dropline - hydraulic hauling

A working dropline remains attached to the vessel at all times. Hydraulic hauling refers to a hydraulically operated deck winch.

Number of Lines / Net Code:

If you are demersal longlining or trotlining record the number of lines per shot.

If you are droplining record the number of line lifts per day.

Number of Hooks:

If you are demersal longlining or trotlining record the number of hooks per shot.

If you are droplining record the average number of hooks per line.

Start Position:

Record this as latitude and longitude in degrees and minutes.

Demersal longliners and trotliners should enter the position when shooting away begins.

Dropliners should enter the position where the first dropline is set.

Finish Position:

Record this as latitude and longitude in degrees and minutes.

Demersal longliners and trotliners should enter the position where each shot finished.

Dropliners should enter the position of the last shot of the day.

Time Details: Use the 24 hour clock (eg. 2359 hrs = 12 midnight, 1300 hrs = 1pm).

Start Time: Enter the time shooting away began.

Finish Time: Demersal longliners and trotliners should enter the time when hauling of each shot began.

Dropliners should enter the time when the last shot of the day was hauled.

Depth Fished: Circle whether depth is being recorded in metres or fathoms

Minimum: Record the minimum depth your gear was fishing. The minimum depth is the depth at which the top hook of your line is fishing.

Maximum: Record the maximum depth your gear was fishing.

Shot Valid: IGNORE THIS AS IT APPLIES TO TRAWLERS ONLY.

CATCH DETAILS

Estimated Wt of Codend: IGNORE THIS AS IT APPLIES TO TRAWLERS ONLY.

Target Species: The species that you target must be recorded with a tick in the column headed "T". More than one species can be ticked.

Retained Species: Estimated whole weight of each species caught and retained should be recorded here, as whole kilograms. The accurate number of each species caught should also be recorded. The main species you are likely to catch are listed. Other species retained should be written in the blank lines provided.

Discard Species: Fish which are not retained and are returned to the sea should be recorded here. Estimated whole weight and accurate number of each discard species caught should be recorded. Weights should be recorded as whole kilograms.

WILDLIFE INTERACTIONS

Wildlife & Protected Shark Species Interactions

For each shot, if you catch or have entangled in your gear a great white, grey nurse shark or wildlife species (seals, whales, dolphin, seabirds, turtles etc.), please indicate by circling the name/s in the appropriate shot/date column that the interaction occurred, then record the details of the animal/s and nature of the interaction on one of the **Wildlife and Protected Shark Interactions forms** provided at the back of the logbook. Please send the completed forms to AFMA along with the logsheets that they relate to. Please remember to check for tags or turtle/bird bands and record details such as tag/band number, date, time and location caught. A list of protected shark species and wildlife is provided in front of the interaction forms.

COMMENTS

This part of the logsheet has been included so that you can make comments to AFMA or record relevant information eg. weather details, gear malfunctions, tagged fish etc.

SIGNATURE BOX

The Concession Holder or Authorised person must sign and date each logsheet after it has been completed. His/her name must also be printed in the space provided.

TRAWLERS: How To Complete This Logbook

If you are trawling, you must complete catch and effort details for every shot you make.

Details for each shot must be recorded before completing the next shot. Details for the last shot of the trip must be completed before the boat enters port.

Gear Code: You should write **TW** in this box (TW is the gear code for trawling).

Number of Lines / Net Code: The Net Code refers to the codes allocated for each of your nets on the gear sheet. If you have more than 3 nets or if you replace nets, you must inform your logbook coordinator.

Hook Code: IGNORE THIS AS IT APPLIES TO LINE FISHERS ONLY.

Start & Finish Position: These positions are to be recorded as latitude and longitude in degrees and minutes.

Start Shot Position: is where the gear setting has stopped and fishing begins.
